QUICK TIPS:

**WORKING WITH HPCSA
PROFESSIONALS**



According to the HPCSA, any member registered to their professional body, is not permitted to form a partnership, association or juristic person with a profession/person/practice not registered with the council.

You are however permitted to be hired or rent space from a HPCSA registered person. You may however not hire a HPCSA registered professional yourself.

You and a HPCSA professional can be hired by the same organization or Association, such as the Down Syndrome Association of Tshwane, to give remedial sessions on their premises.



An HPCSA registered professional is not permitted to directly refer to you for your services, but you are permitted to have a referral list with HPCSA registered professionals.

You are permitted to make an appointment with a HPCSA registered member to talk to them about your services and ask if you can leave your pamphlets in their waiting room.

When receiving a client that has been referred, be sure to treat the client in the same manner you would treat your own.
